A Letter from the Village President



The days are getting shorter, the nights are getting cooler and soon 2015 will be only a memory. It has been a year of changes in Nashotah. We are pleased to announce that we have a new Police Chief. Thom Moerman was promoted after Chief Ken Donovan retired after 27 years of service. Thom is presently streamlining and updating the department. We also have a new Fire Chief, Kevnin Keith, heading our Lake Country Fire & Rescue Department. Kevin is a long time resident of Nashotah and has over 25 years experience in the fire service. We welcome both of these gentlemen and wish them success.

The Village has purchased a second truck for snowplowing. By using our own employees to plow, we anticipate better control over the quality of the plowing operation as well as more closely monitoring the salt usage which will result in purchasing and using less salt.

Next year will be the 20 year anniversary of the Nashotah Fire Station on Rasmus Road. This fine facility was built largely in part by the volunteers of the department at that time. This volunteer effort saved the Village several hundred thousand dollars in construction costs. We are planning a celebration party for the entire village some time this next summer. If you have anything that might be interesting for this event, please contact the Village or Chief Keith. Party plans will be posted on the village website and posting boards.

I would like to take this time to personally thank all of those individuals who contribute to making our Village run as smoothly as it does. We are fortunate to have a great staff that includes the Office, DPW, Plan Commission, Police and Fire Departments, Poll Workers, Village Attorney, Engineer, Assessor, Building Inspector, all other committee members along with all of the rest of those individuals who are quick to volunteer to help wherever needed. Working together we will keep Nashotah "The Pride of Lake Country".
